LEARNINGS IS THE ROOT OF LONG-TERM ADJUSTMENT AND WELLNESS

OSNS provides evidence-based services for children who are delayed in their development of motor, communication, social, emotional and daily living skills.

TREATMENT PROGRAMS

Intervention at OSNS is evidence-based, data-driven and sharply focused on quality care. The team strives to talk about what matters to families and to be accountable for consistent progress as a multidisciplinary organization, OSNS provides integrated pediatric and early educational programming.

EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM

Speech-Language Pathology, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy for children ages birth until school entry. Treatment sessions can be Centre based, home/community based, group or individual.

AUTISM INTERVENTION

A skill-building program for children aged 2-12 with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder. The autism program addresses social skills and communication, play, fine and gross motor skills, self-help skills and emotional regulation.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Inclusive Kinderplace Preschool & Daycare programs. The specialized ECE staff team teach pro-social skills and kindness through strengths-based programming and collaborative, family-centred care.

ASSESSMENT SERVICES

Early years multidisciplinary assessments monitor for at-risk markers and coordination of autism assessments for children under 6.

FAMILY SUPPORT - SOCIAL WORK

Available to all families referred to OSNS. This includes intake meetings and navigation of the Centre and community resources, as well as ongoing support with the process of understanding services, diagnoses and advocacy.

EARLY MENTAL HEALTH WORKSHOPS

A series for parents, caregivers, and community partners includes topics on anxiety, attention deficit disorder, executive functioning and emotional resiliency. Psychology services include cognitive assessments and individual consultations.





PLAY BASED LEARNING

We are an organization with a diverse leadership and staffing team who serve a diverse and vulnerable community and we disguise hard work as play with the goal of building confidence through providing services in Early Intervention.

OUR FACILITY

We have invested time to thoughtfully design our space for optimal play-based learning. The OSNS provides an environment that is bright and happy reflecting, thoughtful planning, focused on maximizing clients' engagement in their surroundings.



Every decision we make about how we organize ourselves has to provide a space this is comforting for families and a place that is motivating for children where they can feel like they have ownership and independence. For our entrance, we have a little door scaled for children so they can feel like this is their space and that they can open the door and get into the building independent of adult help.



OSNS boasts an awesome pirate themed climbing wall. Climbing is an ideal activity to wrk on arm and leg strengthening, coordination and motor planning. It is also an excellent activity to help children and youth feel a sense of accomplishment as they problem solve their way up the wall.



Children at our Centre have the option of taking the slide as an alternative to the stairs. This exciting way down helps children build confidence, take risks, explore countdowns, learn balance and improve physical and visual skills.



Along with the fun of getting dirty, gardening helps children learn valuable lessons about patience, care and responsibility. Gardening provides opportunities to learn about nature, practice cooperation and where food comes from. Every spring, the friendly folks from Garden Works help bring our garden to life.



Eventually, every child will encounter a time when they experience overwhelming emotions. Without self-regulations or a safe place to escape, these emotions can spiral into a chaotic episode. Otis's Cave provides a calm place for children to take a break and diffuse their emotions.



In 2017, NHL player, Duncan Keith, partnered with the the OSNS to build an outdoor adventure playground. His donation has provided children with an engaging space to play outdoors. The even surface also makes it an improved learning area for practicing activities that require balance and co-ordination. The children love to use the track around the playground to practice riding on their bikes.

F-WORDS



Across the South and North Okanagan, we have adopted the F-words strength-based approach to developmental practice. We began in spring 2020 and have infused this holistic and culturally diverse framework into our practices. This work ensures that each family's unique and complex needs are captured in a way that is coming from a strength-based lens. It is more appropriate, acceptable and uplifting than a diagnostic model that begins by looking at deficits.

The 6 F-Words are: Family, Function, Fun, Friends, Fitness and Future.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

We have been using the f-words profile with all of the children in the preschool program. We have used our profile form but also encouraged a collage style profile that the child and family make together and then have used these to create an album for the program that children can look through to show others about themselves and also to learn about their peers common & different interests.

F- words profiles and goal sheets are used for every child who has extra support needs attending the child care programs. They are used as the backbone of the care plan created. These forms are filled in by the family and highlight their knowledge of their own child and the current priorities they have for them. This information is shared with the whole team including Supported Child Development Program to help guide goal setting for individual children.

We have created an F-Words Self Assessment form that the Early Childhood Education team been trialing to help focus on how we are integrating the F-Words practice within our programs and how we might grow our skill in doing so.

We have brought the idea of using F-Words for Child Development forward during community group meetings Changing Results For Young Children (CR4YC) & Strengthening Early Years to Kindergarten Transition (SEY2KT) and some Kindergarten teachers in School District 67 are moving to adopt using the F-Words Profiles as they get to know new children & families.

EARLY INTERVENTION & AUTISM INTERVENTION

Currently in the Early Intervention,(EI) and the Autism Intervention, (AIP) programs are completing F-words as part of initial intake with families. If another organization has completed the intake, clinicians are completing a separate F-words profile with the family. F-words has been implemented to better understand such things as the child's and family's goals, the child's support systems and the child's strengths/interests. EI clinicians and AIP behaviour interventionists take into account all of this to support their intervention.

In February of 2021, OSNS completed their fifth accreditation with the Commission for Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) Throughout the virtual three-day process, OSNS practices and programs were held up against 1134 international standards of excellence resulting in only two recommendations which included increased testing of our payroll process in the event of a disaster and another involving acquiring data on the children we serve several years after they have left our care.

OSNS received the maximum three-year accreditation for:

- · Services for Children and Youth: Child and Adolescent Services
- Services for Children and Youth: Child and Adolescent Services (Autism Spectrum Disorder-Children and Adolescents)
- · Services for Children and Youth: Early Intervention Services
